BVDU College of Nursing, Navi Mumbai takes curriculum feedback from various spheres like course evaluation, clinical placement evaluation & teacher's evaluation by students, curriculum evaluation from teachers and stake holders for improvement in effective implementation of teaching learning activities. Frequent curriculum committee meeting are also conducted for the frequent discussions and implementation of new strategies based on feedback. Suggestion box is placed in college premises for submitting the suggestion by students for improvement of organization in all aspects based on feedback. The mode of receiving feedback is by both online and offline. Informal feedbacks by principal and teachers are taken occasionally in college, clinicals and during guidance and counselling session for internal & external teachers, office staff, library, hostel, extracurricular activities like cultural and sports events, etc.

#### Student feedback

Online feedback forms are prepared by ICT committee under guidance of Principal, BVDU CON, and the content of the form is finalized by the committee members for implementation. Institute have designed the questionnaire and made available online for students. The results are available in online feedback mechanism by using lime survey which is only accessible with user id and password.

The forms are made available to students on ICT portal .They are provided time for completing feedback forms in stipulated duration. Teachers evaluation cover knowledge, practice and attitude domain. Students appreciated the knowledge, skill, technical & guiding ability of teachers. Need to adopt more innovative teaching methods. Need improvement in evaluation, punctuality, IPR and student's control. Computerized

analysis is carried out and results are discussed by Principal in general meeting as well as in person according to need. This rightly helps in taking remedial measures to improve quality of teaching learning activities within the institution. Students have appreciated the teaching in online platform due to Covid -19 pandemic situation, clinical experience, infrastructure and library some suggestions are given regarding more assignments which is been discussed and reduced. Students expressed anxiety about postponement of University examinations. Faced difficulty initially during online lectures due to technical shift and connectivity issues.
